Acclaimed Mexican dance company makes its New England debut at the Bates Dance Festival

LEWISTON, Maine -- In its New England debut, the leading Mexican dance troupe Delfos Danza Contemporanea presents the compelling evening-length work "When Disguises Are Hung Up" in 2015 Bates Dance Festival performances at 7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, July 24 and 25, in Bates College's Schaeffer Theatre, 329 College St.

Delfos co-directors Victor Manuel Ruiz and Claudia Lavista reveal their passion for collaboration and invention in a festival Show & Tell lecture-demonstration at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 21, in Schaeffer Theatre. Dance writer Debra Cash offers a pre-performance Inside Dance lecture at 7 p.m. on July 25. A talkback with the artists follows both concerts.

A work for seven dancers, "Disguises" integrates dance, video, computer animation and music by Mario Lavista, Meredith Monk, Schumann, Sergio Díaz, Bach and Vivaldi into a reflection on appearances, and the loss and rediscovery of the self. Both deeply conceptual and accessible, "Disguises" is one of the most esteemed works in Delfos' repertory.

Choreographer-dancers Lavista and Ruiz founded Delfos in 1992 as a collective of artists whose creative vision is distinguished by the fluid physicality and poetic narratives within their diverse repertory. Delfos' work has been presented throughout Latin America as well as Canada, the United States, Europe, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea and Lebanon.

Delfos has won worldwide critical praise; several major awards including the Mexican National Dance Award; and the distinct honor of being the only Mexican company selected to tour extensively in the U.S. with the support of the National Dance Project.
